However, we already now wish to express our concern about the less favorable exchange rate, which puts additional pressure on our already stressed economy. The value of the Swedish crown in relation to the Kenyan shilling has dropped 10 to 15 %. On an annual basis this corresponds to one whole, and almost two monthly contributions from the Society to the school. We try to scrutinize the school's costs in various ways, but there remains a risk that the reductions will affect the way in which we wish to operate the school. We would be very grateful if you, through making an extra donation, would help us to improve upon the present situation. It is also very valuable to us to get all suggestions of additional organizations or persons, who in different ways may support our efforts for the school.

We also want to promote "Kulturmatten" (an evening of culture) in Norrköping on Saturday, Sept. 27th. The Society will have a booth for i.a. selling gems outside café Jolla in Prästgatan.
