Hello!

The building of the S:t Christine school in Kabondo began 12 years ago. The society started with 41 deeply engaged members in 2002 and has since through membership fees, various activities and engaged sponsors funded the development of the school and its operation. Today most of the building work is completed and the main costs consist of maintenance and operation. In spite of this the financing of the school activities has not become any easier. This year the school has 350 students and the Society's monthly contribution is SEK 50 000. The exchange rate has dropped by 10-15 % which means that our membership fees are now insufficient to cover all costs, and we are working in different ways to increase our revenues. Today the total monthly cost for a pupil is about SEK 200. In an attempt to secure the funding for the school the board has decided to set up an application for a so called 90-account at Svensk Insamlingskontroll, a body which surveys notprofit organisations' fund raising. It will also perform annual checks to allow the Society to retain this type of account. The board has together with the Foundation arrived at the conclusion that we need to make certain adjustments to our organisation and accounting in order to make the transactions between the Society and the school easier to check and follow up. If the application is approved, the Society has to pay an initial fee and then annual fees. We assess that we will be ready to make a formal application after the turn of the year. Then we have to wait and see how long it will take and if there is some form of test period before we can have our 90-account. The costs for such an account are deemed to be reasonable in relation to the possible benefits in collecting funds for the operation of the school. If we are approved for having a 90-account we will continuously follow up and evaluate costs and results. We will provide further information later.

Finally a short summary/excerpt from Head Master David's latest report from the second semester, from May 5th to August 8th.

Greetings to you all. All the students in the school have cooperated well with the teachers, which means that the work has progressed and the students have reached very good results, above the average for corresponding schools. This indicates that all the pupils will pass the exams at the end of the year. This semester has included lots of sports and drama, where the children have been very successful and won several rewards. The sickness cases among the children were few and they were mainly at good health. Those who needed medical care were sent to the nearby health care center, where they received treatment. All the teachers have worked well and are at good health. They have put in their best efforts for the children, and we can look back at a good cooperation among the teachers, which also contributed to the school's good result. The staff meet regularly and discuss the challenges we meet in the education and the best ways to work with and develop the teaching. The kitchen staff has done a fantastic job. The housekeeping works well and the cleaning staff makes sure every day that the children have a clean environment. Evans and I myself participated in a two days' visit to Mumias east of Kisumu. We brought back our experience and knowledge from the visit and have shared the content and experience from the two days with the teachers.
