As we have written in earlier newsletters the number of contributions from the Association's members has decreased in the last few years. The school's rescue was the larger contributions we received from "IBM supports the world's children", "Handelsbankens fadderbarnsfond" and different groups within Rotary and other bigger private gifts. But without the contributions from our members we won't manage, so please help us to find new members and other persons who may be interested in sponsoring a very good and important school, which makes a huge difference to the children of Kabonda.

### St Christine School's future existence is threatened!

St Christine School has 2019 existed in 15 years as a free school for many of the orphaned children in Kabondo. Since the start in 2004, as an average, 30 pupils per year beginning in 2012, have passed the elementary school exams KCPE. The school has been among the best in the region for many years, and a few pupils reached the top KCPE results among the around twenty schools in the region. Through the years only very few (a total of 3 - 4) didn't reach the grade level needed to qualify for continued education in secondary school. Many have also started and completed secondary shool, in many cases with sponsoring from families in Sweden or local scholarships. Some have even continued studies at university level with economic support from Sweden.

The younger pupils have competed successfully in drama and music, even at the national level.

In other words, St Christine School has become very important for the children and families in the village, who lack economic resources to let the children get an education, which in the best cases, leads to a job. One proof of this is, among others, is that the children's custodians provide as much corn as the school needs, which is a great help in providing meals for the children each day.

In the last years we have unfortunately met setbacks as fraud and theft of resources intended for the school's operation and theft of 25 laptop computers. In all these cases personnel from the school were involved. The students' results have, in spite of these sad incidents, still been among the best. We have now rectified this by dismissing some staff, replacing the school management and implementing even stricter purchasing control. We are sorry to say, that we have not received any support from the police as we have reported the case fo theft and fraud. Kenya is a country with big corruption and those who have the means, can buy themselves free.

All this has led to big costs for the school, which in turn reduced our bank accounts in Kenya as well as in Sweden. In the last year we had a few big sponsors, and their contributions were absolutely vital for the the possibility to continue the operation of the school during the year. The membership donations declined considerably during the year, which is worrying when looking towards the future.

With this letter I therefore beg all of you members to continue supporting the orphan children with Christmas gifts and continuous monthly donations to the Kisumu Association.
