Latest news from the school and the situation in the village

As you all know has the African continent also been hit by Covid-19. All schools in Kenya are closed. For how long is presently unknown. This means that the pupils of St Christine stay at home with their custodians and they get no tuition now. The authority urges the schools to support the children's learning at home with material adapted to their age via different online platforms. This is not possible for the children in St Christine (and many schools outside the big cities) as they have no access to a Smartphone and even less to a computer. The teachers of St Christine try to support the upper grade students in particular with homework so that they will have a better chance to pass the exam at the end of the school year. The whole staff work in a daytime schedule from 8 to 16 in order to have people present in the school when the janitors are not on duty. This is important in order to avoid unwanted visits to the school. Many Kenyans are hard hit by the pandemic and have lost whatever small income they had. This means increased risks of theft and burglaries. Head master Calvince has established a work plan for the staff including cleaning the school, gathering trash, maintenance of the school grounds, lawns and garden, weeding and various repairs of buildings and the playground equipment.

The director of the area's schools has visited the school to check that the authority's directives are being followed, i.e. that the pupils stay at home and no teaching is going on. He found nothing to criticize in St Christine. In accordance with decisions made the schools remain closed for 30 days from May 4th meaning week 23 included. We don't know what will happen after that. KENYA PRIVATE SCHOOLS ASSOCIATION (KPSA) keeps all private schools continually informed of what happens and decisions made.

Farming of corn and beans

Odada informs that the harvest of both corn and beans, which the staff planted on the ground he managed to lease on the school's account, looks promising. If it continues in same manner it will probably cover the school's need to the end of the school year.

Audit report from Kenya

Audit of the school's management is made. In connection with this, the auditor wanted a few clarifications regarding purchase procedures and bookkeeping. In these areas new procedures were implemented in the year and after the clarifications from the Foundation the auditor had nothing to critizise and the audit is approved. If needed the auditor supports and helps Calvince and Augustin in economic matters.

Annual meeting April 22nd

The meeting was held with a small number of people physically present and others participating via telephone. It is fantastic which possibilities the digital technology offers. Together with this newsletter we distribute records from the annual meeting, financial report from 2019 and budget for 2020.
