Latest news from the school and the situation in the village

In connection with our latest board meeting Ulla participated and gave us the latest news from the school. The school is now open, and tuition is going on in 4th and 8th grade. The 8th grade will graduate in March 2021 and the 4th grade will have their exams in the middle of March for advancement to 5th grade. In October the 4th and 8th grades performed a sort of national tests. The purpous was to check the students' status after such a long break (since March 2020). The results show continued good levels for the students in both classes. The other classes follow a new school year plan created by the school authorities, which means that they start their second semester of 2020 on April 1, 2021. Holidays and semesters will be be pushed forward until they hopefully will be in phase in 2022.

The school and Covid 19

The school has not had any cases of Covid 19, among either the pupils or the staff. They adhere strictly to the issued hygiene routines concerning hand hygiene, distance and temperature checks. A "guard hut" with a water outlet was built at the entrance to the school grounds and here everyone wash their hands and the temperature is checked on both students and teachers before they are allowed into the grounds.
