Latest news from S:t Christine School

This strange year the schools in Kenya had to change their semesters and vacations because the schools were closed for 8 months last year. They now try to catch up, primarily by shortening the vacations. Just now they have a ten day vacation and start school again on Tuesday October 12. At the end of the last semester the school management invited all parents and custodians and the presence was larger than ever. Head master Calvince's explanation for this is that they love the school and have full confidence in teachers and management. The school has established clear expectations of both students and teachers, and this is accepted by everyone. Every week the head master writes a report on what has happened in the school and sends it to Sweden. The staff also produce weekly reports with many pictures on our joint page in What's app.

Calvince has been asked by his colleagues (other school administrators) to explain why the school has reached such success all since 2012, when the first eight graders passed their KCPE (primary school graduation) with good results. In a meeting with other school administrators, when S:t Christine had the best result in a test, including 30 schools in the neighbor area, Calvince explained it like this:

- Always be a good role model
- Strive to unite colleagues, parents and custodians, pupils and the members of the local community.
- Make sure that food is available in teh school.
- Always stay updated on what happens in the surrounding world.
- Delegate tasks so that each one is responsible
- for his/her domain.
- Inspire pupils and teachers to achievements
- Make sure that necessary resources for teachers and students in the form of books and utensils are available.

A new curriculum is now introduced in Kenya during these difficult times. It is now ready up to fifth grade. Several additional programs are now included in the curriculum, 13 compared with 6 before. The new ones are of more practical/esthetic nature as sports, music, home making, arts and crafts, farming but also science and technology. The activities are more student centered. All this will require more equipment and material, which will cost a great deal. On the wish list is also laptops, smartphones and TV.

Calvince is planning to invite experts in the different fields to the school for inspiration and help to go forward towards the same good results as before.

The covid-status in the school is good. No pupils or staff members have been taken ill. Issued

recommendations are followed carefully. The staff members have received their first vaccine shot and will soon get the second one.
